Charity Stalls

The Council maintains a charity stall at each market site, which is available on a specific day each week.

The stall is available free of charge to Schools

Bookings for this facility (on a first come - first served basis) can be made by contacting the relevant market office, in person, by phone, by email or by letter.

Once a date has been agreed for you to stand, you must confirm the booking in writing on the charity's headed paper.

Let your students have a real taste of life in a busy competitive market environment by running their "own" stall at one of Calderdale's open markets in Elland, Hebden Bridge, Sowerby Bridge or Todmorden.

Use of the stall is free for educational purposes including:

- promotion of adult learning
- literacy classes
- parent teacher fundraising events.

Schools Farmers Markets

The Council hold sole and exclusive rights to operate markets. If you are considering holding a Market type event or similar it may be that your event is classified by law as a market. In such cases, you are required to obtain consent from Council Markets Authority.

The Markets Service can provide market stalls for such events and discuss the potential to provide markets at your school venue.

History
